Debris pick up on private roads

GLYNN COUNTY, Ga.- The Glynn County Board of Commissioners voted to pick up storm related debris from Hurricane Matthew on private streets and gated communities at their regularly scheduled Board meeting on October 20, 2016. Because private/gated communities are private property, the County is restricted from initiating work on the property without prior approval from the property owner.

Any private street or gated community that wishes to request debris pick-up should have a representative contact the Glynn County debris pick-up coordinator by sending an email to debrisremoval@glynncounty-ga.gov or calling 912-554-7740. A Right of Entry agreement will be required by any Home Owners Association (HOA) or private land owners (in the case of a private street) interested in participating in the debris pick-up program. In addition, the form may be picked up in person at the Harold Pate Building, 1725 Reynolds St., Suite 224.

The Right of Entry form will require the applicant to provide the address of the property, Parcel number (this information can be found on a property tax bill or on the County's GIS Property Information website at <http://qpublic.net/ga/glynn/>) and release of insurance information if debris removal is covered by an insurance policy on the property. The applicant will need to provide a narrative description as to why the debris is a public safety concern and photos documenting the debris. This information is necessary to grant permission for the County or its contractor to conduct work on private property and will be required in seeking federal reimbursement. If you are unsure whether or not your road is a private road, you can find the previously posted debris pickup maps on the same page (www.glynncounty.org/773/Severe-Weather-TS-Hurricane-Updates). County-owned roads are highlighted in red. If your road is not highlighted and is not a State Highway or Route, the County will need permission to access the right-of-way on your street and you should follow the procedures outlined above. Debris from State Highways and Routes will be picked up by the Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT). Please contact the local GDOT area office at 912-264-7247 for further clarification.
