The Following Resolution offered by Commissioner V.H.Royal and Seconded by
Commissioner Abbott was adopted:-

BE IT, and it is hereby resolved by the Commissioners of Roads and Revenue of
Glynn County, Georgia, in regular meeting assembled, that there be and is hereby levied
and assessed for the year 1939 on all Real and Personal Property in said County subject
to taxation, to provide the necessary revenue for the requirements of the County, the
following taxes for the following purposes:-

1.	To pay interest on bonded indebtedness and bonded indebtedness,	.006000
2.	To pay any other lawful charges against the County,	.000225
3.	To pay Sheriff's and other officers their fees,	.000450

Or \$17.00 on the \$1,000.00

And, Also a local School Tax to be levied on all property outside of the Corporate
Limits of the City of Brunswick, therein, of .005 or \$5.00 on the \$1,000.00, being the
rate fixed and certified to this Board by the Board of Education of Glynn County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all such taxes be collected by the Tax Commissioner of
said County, or his successors in office in the manner prescribed by law.

J.W.Buggs and Rev. Brockington appeared before commission in reference to taxes
due on certain property of Zion Association located in the City of Brunswick, which was to
be donated as a Playground for colored children, they were asking for some relief of past
due taxes. It was moved by Commissioner Owens, and seconded by Commissioner Abbott that
Chairman be instructed to investigate the matter further

The following Resolution was offered by Commissioner Abbott, Seconded by Commissioner Royal
and unanimously adopted. Copy of which be sent to Mrs. Townsend and The Press).

W H E R E A S, It has pleased Almighty God to call to his rest Honorable Alfred O. Townsend, the Clerk of this Board, who has industriously, faithfully and most efficiently served us and the people of Glynn County for more than forty years;

RESOLVED, that, in bowing to the Supreme Mandate, the Commissioners of Roads and Revenue of Glynn County, for itself and its individual members, and in behalf of Glynn County, desires to acknowledged and record permanently its sense of the great loss suffered by all of us in his passing, knowing that the good effects of his public labor will be known and felt for untold years to come; and

RESOLVED FURTHER that a copy of these resolution be furnished to his bereaved family and to the Press.

Peter George appeared before commission asking for a reduction or pro-ration of Beer and Liquor License for his place on Darien road.

Moved by Commissioner Royal, seconded by Commissioner Ownes that a charge for one-half year be granted .

Mrs. S.W. Popwell and Committee appeared before commission with petition signed by various Citizens asking for repairs to be made on certain road in the County.

Upon investigation it was found that this was not a public road and County would be unable to do this work and that Committee be so advised.

The following Resolution was offered by Commisioner Abbott, seconded by Commissioner Royal.

WHEREAS, Frank Anderson having made an offer for the western one-half (W.1/2) of Town Commons Lot No. Forty-seven (47) located between Albany and Amherst Streets, being ninety by ninety (90 x 90) feet in dimensions, in the sum of two hundred dollars, (\$200.00), and payment of the taxes due thereon to the City of Brunswick for the purchase of said property;

BE IT, THEREFORE, RESOLVED, Upon motion duly made and seconded that the offer of Frank Anderson be accepted and that the Chairman of the County Commissioners together with the Clerk thereof be authorized to execute to Frank Anderson a Deed to said property for the sum of Two Hundred Dollars, (\$200.00).

Communication received from King and Prince Club regarding the use of certain parkway areas on St. Simons Island for Sewerage Drain Disposal. On motion by Commissioner Owens, Seconded by Commissioner Abbott that this matter be referred to County Engineer Friedman and Planning Board for handling and contracts or leases, etc., be prepared by County Attorney Conyers.

There being a vacancy on the Coastal Highway Commission on account of the death of A.O. Townsend, on Motion duly seconded, Mr. J.N. Parham unanimously to fill this position.

It was moved and duly seconded and unanimously passed that Mrs. A.O. Townsend be employed as Supervisor of the Court House Grounds at a Salary of \$35.00 per month, beginning August 1st., 1939.

In the matter of disposing of car used by A.O. Townsend, Clerk, It was

ordered that this car be turned over to Superintendent of Roads, E.F.Higginbotham and to get bids and sell the car now used by him to highest bidder.

It was moved by Commissioner Harley, seconded by Commissioner Ratcliffe that Mrs. Townsend be paid \$25.00 for Radio in car formerly used by Clerk.

In the matter of charging off Errors and Defaulters as due by Delinquent Tax Payers, it was moved by Commissioner Abbott, seconded by Commissioner Ratcliffe that authority is granted to make such charge-offs as appeared on list submitted by Tax Commissioner Exley and said sheets initialed by Commissioner Harley.

Communication received from Brunswick Peninsula Company in regard to taxes due by them for several years.

It was moved by Commissioner Royal, Seconded by Commissioner Abbott that the sum of \$750.00 be appropriated to the Brunswick Peninsula Company in connection with certain work as to securing Pulp Mill, further that they be paid for right-of-way deeded to State Highway Commission at the rate of \$25.00 per acre for land and \$50.00 per acre for Borrow Pits, with the proviso that said sums so paid shall apply on taxes due by them. Also, further, that certain amounts of interest due on unpaid taxes be remitted.

On motion by Commissioner Abbott, seconded by Commissioner Royal, it was ordered that Deeds be executed to J.Phil Brown to certain property located at Fancy Bluff for the sum of \$200.00 that map and plan of said property be prepared by County Engineer.

The Commission went into Executive Session and the following motion by Commissioner Harley, seconded by Commissioner Royal, and, on unanimous vote, H.J.Friedman was elected as Engineer-Clerk of Commission, at salary of \$4,800.00 per annum, plus regular car expense of \$50.00.
