REGULAR RECESSED MEETING OF COMMISSIONERS OF ROADS & REVENUE HELD THURSDAY, OCTOBER 5th, 1939.

Present:- R. A. Gould, W. McD. Harley, R. L. Ratcliffe, C. V. Abbott, V. H. Royal and J. B. D. Paulk.

Minutes previous meeting read and approved.

Reports from following received and ordered filed:-

Clerk, St. Simons Highway,
Chief of County Police,
Department of Public Welfare,
City Hospital,
Superintendent of Roads,
Tax Commissioner,
Clerk of City Court,
Special Tax Collector of Delinquent Taxes.

Moved by Commissioner Abbott, Seconded by Commissioner Paulk to approve all monthly bills. Unanimously adopted.

Delegation headed by Mr. Vinson protesting location of colored laborer's dwellings on property of Brunswick Peninsula Company at their Still near Chappell Crossing was heard and delegation was advised that Commission was without authority to take action in the matter.

Moved by Commissioner Harley, Seconded by Commissioner Paulk to appropriate Twenty Seven Dollars (\$27.00) to take care of one half of the cost of an advertisement in the Coastal Empire Development Edition of the Morning News of October 26th, the City of Brunswick to take care of remaining half. Unanimously passed.

Moved by Commissioner Harley, Seconded by Commissioner Royal to request a financial report of the operation of the Information Office and Amusement Park by the Board of Governors of the St. Simon's Island Board of Trade and also advice as to when a payment might be expected. Unanimously adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Royal, Seconded by Commissioner Ratcliffe to approve the following procedure in connection with the collection of 1932-1936 taxes, subject to approval of the State Department of Revenue:-

- 1- Secure relief, after proper analysis, of all small tax executions that could not be practicably collected.
- 2- Register with the Clerk of the Superior Court such 1932 tax executions as are collectible but would not justify the cost of advertising sale of the property involved.
- 3- Ordering sale of property on the remaining tax executions. Unanimously adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Royal, Seconded by Commissioner Harley, to authorize relieving errors and defaulters in accordance with the list (4) sheets) submitted by Tax Commissioner Exley as of September 30th, 1939. Unanimously passed.

Moved by Commissioner Abbott, Seconded by Commissioner Ratcliffe to approve the substitution of collateral pledged by the Brunswick Bank & Trust Company in accordance with the following letter and memorandum of securities now on deposit: Unanimously adopted:

Referring to our letter of January 18th, 1937, also our letter of September 7th, 1939, pledging certain bonds to secure funds on deposit in this Bank in the name of Commissioners of Roads and Revenue of this County in our Checking Department.

We have today withdrawn \$50,000.00 par value 2 7/8% U. S. Treasury Bonds of 1955-60 from the bonds so pledged and desire to substitute the following bonds for the above described bonds:

\$5,000 Georgia Power Company 5% Bonds due March 1st, 1967.

10,000 State of Arkansas 4 1/2% Bonds Series A due 1956.

35,000 Federal Farm Mortgage 3 1/4% Bonds of 1944-64.

We attach a memorandum listing in detail all of the bonds now pledged after making the above substitution.

Moved by Commissioner Royal, Seconded by Commissioner Abbott to authorize appointment of all Timber Protective Organization Employees in Glynn County as Deputy Game Wardens, the question of compensation to be investigated. Unanimously adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Royal, Seconded by Commissioner Harley to authorize the Chairman and Clerk to investigate the taxes of Miss Leah Brown and make such adjustment as they consider justified.
