Pathway out of gang violence program

GLYNN COUNTY, Ga. – The Glynn County Police Department and Glynn County Sheriff’s Office will be participating in the “Pathway out of gang violence” programs hosted by the Community First Planning Commission and Build a Better Brunswick organization being held on Friday, July 1st and Saturday, July 2nd.

Glynn County Police, City of Brunswick Police, and the Glynn County Sheriff’s office will compete against a select group of young men from Brunswick in the “City of Brunswick Takes on Law Enforcement” basketball game which will be held on Friday, July 1, 2016 from 6:30 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. at the Risley Annex (2900 Albany St., Brunswick). General Admission is \$3.00.

A community block party will take place on Saturday, July 2, 2016 from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at Perry Park (2106 K St., Brunswick) that will include a job fair, health fair, and basketball tournament.
