County Seeks input for Comp Plan

GLYNN COUNTY, Ga.- The Glynn County Board of Commissioners is seeking public input for the 2018 Comprehensive Plan. The Georgia Department of Community Affairs (DCA) requires that communities complete and maintain a Comprehensive Plan to help direct future growth and development. The Comprehensive Plan is designed to be a community-guided document that identifies community goals, needs and opportunities, and a vision for the future.

The public is invited to provide comments through a community survey available at www.surveymonkey.com/r/envisionglynn and on www.glynncounty.org/compplan. In addition, Glynn County is hosting two open houses to educate residents and business owners on the County's 2018 Comprehensive Plan. The purpose of these open houses is to let the community know about this process and to provide a venue for public feedback. Community members can give their opinions on various goals, issues, opportunities, and help guide the development of a future vision for the County. The survey results along with input provided at the Open House events will be reviewed by the Steering Committees and used to guide the direction of the Comprehensive Plan.
