## **Hurricane Dorian Update #2**

GLYNN COUNTY, Ga.- Due to the slowing and southward track of Hurricane Dorian in the Atlantic, the initial time frame of any potential effects has been pushed back and Glynn County does not plan to make any official decisions this weekend (August 31- September 1, 2019) unless the predicted track of the storm changes. At this time, the predicted landfall of the storm is in South Florida early next week.

Coastal Georgia is currently under a state of emergency. This declaration extends to commerce and the uninterrupted supply of petroleum products, emergency or disaster related materials, supplies, goods and services. Glynn County has not declared a state of emergency.

A coastal flooding advisory is still in effect. The seasonally high tides are predicted to be lower later in the week and, while flooding is still an issue due to storm surge and rain, the outlook is more favorable.

For non-emergency calls, please use 912-554-3645 to free up 911 lines for emergency calls. Glynn County Animal Control is offering free microchipping for pets from 12:00 -5:00 p.m. August 30-31, 2019, to aid in finding lost pets. Interstate 95 will likely see increased traffic as people move from the direct path of the hurricane.

There are no closures to announce at this time from the Glynn County School System, the City of Brunswick, Jekyll Island Authority, FLETC, or Glynn County. We will continue to monitor conditions and updates will be available at [www.glynncounty.org](http://www.glynncounty.org) and on the Glynn County EMA Facebook daily at noon throughout the weekend. The Facebook video updates will continue next week. We advise the public to use the latest forecast models from the National Weather Service Jacksonville to stay informed between updates.
