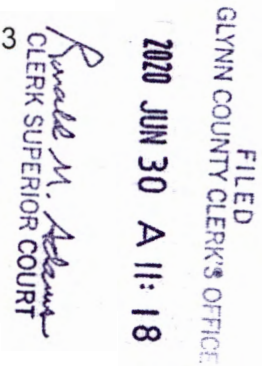

ORDER FOR ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES
FROM DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE



Upon the return of the indictment against Travis McMichael, Greg McMichael and William R Bryan on June 24, 2020, the Glynn County Clerk's Office requested that the District Attorney Pro Tempore process the indictment through the County's case management system (Tyler's Odyssey system). Doing so would allow the clerk to create the case in Odyssey and allow parties to e-file documents; a process known internally as "lightning bolt".


The Cobb County District Attorney's office, acting as District Attorney Pro Tempore, due to the recusal of the District Attorney's Office for the Brunswick Judicial Circuit, has no ability to utilize the protected, internal Odyssey system at the District Attorney's Office for the Brunswick Judicial Circuit in order to perform the administrative data entry necessary to transfer these charges via the "lightning bolt" system to the clerk's office.

Wherefore, this Court is appointing Ms. Vicki Moore, a legal assistant within the District Attorney's Office for the Brunswick Judicial Circuit, to act as an agent of the District Attorney Pro Tempore to perform these purely administrative functions on the District Attorney's side of the Odyssey computer system, and "lightning bolt" the charges from the indictment to the Glynn County Clerk of Superior Court, purely as a necessary computer function, to move forward with the case.

The District Attorney Pro Tempore will provide Ms. Vicki Moore with the necessary copies of the indictment, the arrest warrants, and booking information, or any other information required to perform this administrative computer function.

Given the Brunswick District Attorney's recusal the District Attorney Pro Tempore shall ensure that a screening method is implemented in order to protect against any potential conflict of interest. Said method shall include the following elements: (1) a prohibition against the recused party from having any connection with the matter beyond that specifically ordered herein; (2) a ban on discussions with or the transfer of documents to or from the agent and the recused party; and (3) a restriction on access to information sent by the District Attorney Pro Tempore to the office of the recused party.
