SPLOST Collections

Glynn County, Ga. – The Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax (SPLOST) 2016 referendum was passed by the voters of Glynn County on the November 8, 2016 ballot. SPLOST allows the County to collect a 1 percent sales tax to be used for various capital outlay projects. SPLOST Collections began on April 1, 2017 and are set to sunset on September 30, 2020 or when the amount of \$71,595,000 is collected. In June of 2020, SPLOST collections had reached \$71,595,000. The County contacted the Georgia Department of Revenue (DOR) to seek guidance. The DOR advised the County that the goal amount had not been met in time for the DOR to legally be able to end the tax at the end of June 2020. Because of this situation, we were also advised that the current SPLOST collection will end at the end of September 2020. Collections above the \$71,595,000 will continue to be split with the City of Brunswick at a rate of 19.32% which is based on the population of the City of Brunswick as is required by SPLOST law. The additional collections received by the County will be used to fund uncompleted SPLOST 2016 projects and reimburse the general fund for monies that were used to completed SPLOST 2016 projects.
